Nebo District continues to have success with keeping our student/employee COVID cases in check. Of course, we all know that a spike in cases could occur at any time in a Nebo community or at a school. We thank you for your efforts to help us keep our schools open and encourage everyone to continue their commitment.

Want to change from Remote Learning to At-School Learning or vice versa?

When families chose between At-School Learning or Remote Learning at the start of the school year, we asked them to remain with that choice for the first term. Term 1 ends on October 29 giving families the opportunity to change from Remote Learning to At-School Learning or vice versa. **The window of time to declare a change for Term 2 will be from October 5 thru October 20.** Your child’s school will send you an email a day or so before this window with a link for declaring a change. You only need to submit the electronic form if you want to make a change from what you are currently doing.

* In order to help maintain individual privacy and confidentiality, we will not be providing school-by-school information. **If any individual school sees a high enough number of active cases to impact “At-School Learning,” the families of that school will be contacted directly.**

** The bulk of these transmissions continue to be community spread (**social and family interactions**), as opposed to school spread transmissions. We appreciate the effort being made by everyone in the school settings. Remember, these efforts could be lost if students do not adhere to Health Orders outside of the school setting to avoid large group gatherings, to physical distance, and to always wear a mask when physical distancing is NOT possible. Failure to follow these guidelines increases our risk that they will bring cases into our schools.
