#### Trust lands: Joe Kelly

Joe gave an update on the allocation of the trust land money. He made sure everyone received a copy of last years trust land proposal.

#### Accreditation: Joe Kelly

Joe gave an explanation of the accreditation process. He discussed the experience we had last time. Landmark is not up for another accreditation for two years, but they have opted to do it a year early. The reasons for this are: the new building and Adult Education. #### Comprehensive Guidance: Ted Davies
