



New Evaluation System for Educators

Teachers and administrators are learning a new evaluation system that is aligned with new state requirements. The intent of the new system is to improve students' educational experience and academic achievement by supporting teachers in their efforts to improve instruction. While some learning will be required by all, Nebo's transition to the new evaluation tool will be minimal because our previous tools (NSET & NSEL) are so similar to the new state tool. They are both based on the same standards and both are in rubric format. That's great news! These new tools will be used to evaluate all certified educators, not just teachers and administrators. All Nebo certified educators, along with all certified educators statewide, will create their own professional growth plan (PGP) and complete a self-evaluation each year.

Educators will have time to learn and implement the new evaluation system this year without involving the components of student growth data, stakeholder input (parent and student surveys) or performance pay. Details on these components and their rollout from the state are still forthcoming. This new evaluation is not currently connected to merit pay.

As we begin learning and implementing the new evaluation system, we look forward to the opportunities we will have to reflect on our current practices, set goals to improve, work together to reach our goals, and then assess our effectiveness—all while keeping our focus on doing what is best for students.

Affordable Care Act Notice
