"It's not the magic that makes it work; it's the way we work that makes it magic."

This quote is so indicative of the way our District employees have risen up to support our students and communities these last several months. It also reminds me of a Disney World experience that is similar to our current situation, Lee Cockerell, former Executive Vice President for Operations at Disney World, recalls the following:

"During my sixteen years as a senior Disney executive, I repeated [this] phrase about making magic hundreds of times. But its full magnitude hit me with hurricane force literally – in the summer of 2004. That's when Disney World was hammered by [two] major hurricanes in a little more than a month.

"In August, Hurricane Charley swept through Orlando on Friday the 13th... The area had not fully recovered when Frances came roaring in two weeks later – on Labor Day weekend when Disney was host to seventy-five thousand guests. We were forced to close the theme parks on both occasions, something we had done only twice before, once on 9/11 and once in 1999 for Hurricane Floyd, which fortunately veered away at the last minute.

"What I remember most about the ordeal is not the terrifying winds or the sleepless nights... when we gathered to make plans

to ensure the safety of our Guests and fellow Cast Members. Instead, I remember the dedication of our staff, the precision of our communications, and the smooth way everyone did what he or she was supposed to do even though it had never been done be-

> "[We all] worked through the night, with everyone acting as one to get the parks ready for our Guests. The next morning, we opened on time. And the families who poured in were astonished to find the sunlit theme parks looking spotless and the operations running as if nothing had happened. What they could not see was the massive amount of teamwork behind the scenes that made it all possible or the stress and fatigue behind the smiling faces that greeted them.

"It's easy to think you're doing well when times are good. The real test comes when a crisis hits, and our response to this one validated... that strong commitment and exceptional performance... create Magic." (Creating Magic, Lee Cockerell, p. 1-4)

I am struck by the positive similarities between this Disney example and our own response during this time of crisis. Thank you all for being the Magic here in our District!

Thinking of retiring at the end of 2020-21?

With the Early Retirement Incentive Plans, we recognize that many of our outstanding employees will be contemplating retirement at the end of this school year. We will be sad to see these good friends and dedicated coworkers leave our ranks and are so appreciative of their service to students.

In order to find the best possible candidates for open positions in the current competitive job market, it is important for supervisors to begin hiring new employees as soon as possible. Therefore, we are once again offering an Early Retirement Notice Incentive to those who have their retirement approved by the Board of Education before mid-February. The details are as follows:

- Any employee who is eligible for and retires from Utah Retirement System (URS) by June 30, 2021, can submit the final paperwork to the District by:
 - ♦ November 6, 2020, to receive \$1,000 in their November 30 paycheck, or
 - ♦ December 4, 2020, to receive \$1,000 in their December 31 paycheck, or
 - ♦ January 8, 2021, to receive \$1,000 in their January 31 paycheck, or
 - ♦ February 5, 2021, to receive \$500 in their February 29 paycheck.
- ♦ The final application deadline for this Early Retirement Notice Incentive is February 5, 2021.

This incentive is a one-time option for those who will retire at the end of the 2020-2021 school year. Interested employees who will be retirement eligible and would like to learn more about this option and their individual benefits may schedule an appointment with Troy Bohling at 801-354-7414. Retirement eligible employees will be given first priority for appointments.
