"Be Mindful"

There are many ways to think about what it means to be *Mindful*, including suitable synonyms – awareness, thoughtfulness, compassion. When I think about being *Mindful*, I'm drawn to the following from Author David Brooks. He suggests that *The Road to Character* begins by changing the question, "What do I want from life?" to a different set of questions: "What does life want from me? What are my circumstances calling me to do?"

"They make you feel funnier and smarter when you speak with them... They have not led lives of conflict-free tranquility, but have struggled toward maturity. They have gone some way toward solving life's essential problem, which is that, 'the line separating good and evil passes not through states, nor between classes, nor between political parties either – but right through every human heart."

(from "The Road to Character," Introduction)

He continues, "You come across certain people who... have achieved inner integration. They are calm, settled, and rooted. They are not blown off course by storms. They don't crumble in adversity. Their minds are consistent and their hearts are dependable.



At some point in life I hope to attain this level of mindfulness. In the meantime, I will listen and learn from the many wise and mindful people around me.

Let's all continue to do our best to "Be the Magic" for our students and peers by demonstrating what it means to be *Mindful*.



"None of them is even close to perfect. But they practice a mode of living that is less common now. They [are] acutely aware of their own weakness.

"They radiate a sort of mental joy. They answer softly when challenged harshly... They are dignified when others try to humiliate them, restrained when others try to provoke them. But they get things done... They just seem delighted by the flawed people around them. They just recognize what needs doing and they do it.
