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Superintendent's Message: Choose2Matter

Captain Scott Kelly is a decorated United States astronaut who completed a record-setting 340 day mission to the International Space Station. He recently spoke to public educators and school board members about his space adventures, and the pathway that brought him to world-renowned

fame. Two of his life experiences stood out to me as an educator who wants to make a difference:

 Scott was not a great student. In fact, he struggled quite a bit in school and was fortunate to graduate from high school and attend a small college. While walking through the college

bookstore one day, <u>The Right Stuff</u>, by Tom Wolfe, caught his eye. He bought it, read it, and decided at that moment to become an astronaut. Scott's teachers obviously impacted him by instilling in him a passion for learning, a thirst for knowledge, and a determination to succeed.

◆ Captain Kelly almost failed to become a testfighter pilot when his tailhook slammed into the side of the aircraft carrier during his daytime examination. His only other chance to qualify was to pass the nighttime exam – a much more difficult test. A veteran pilot, who offered to coach Captain Kelly, noticed that Scott became too comfortable while things were going smoothly in flight and neglected to make small, but necessary adjustments to prepare for landing. The lesson learned, Captain Kelly passed the night test and became a test-fighter pilot.

These examples, and the many other life ex-

periences that he shared, all point to one theme: others in his life "Chose2Matter", helping Captain Scott Kelly succeed in ways that may have seemed impossible at times.

Thank you, Nebo employees, for making a difference in the lives of students. We may have astronauts

among us, we may not, but every child deserves the gift of your influence and your genius. You Matter!

Nebo District Receives Highest Bond Rating

In March, Dale Okerlund, Nebo School District Financial Advisor, announced that Nebo School District received the highest bond rating of AAA by Fitch Ratings, Inc. Nebo's bond rating was upgraded from AA to AAA. While the AA rating is very good, the new AAA is the highest rating possible.

Fitch stated, "The revised criteria highlight the district's strong revenue growth prospects, solid expenditure control, a low long-term liability burden, and exceptionally strong gap-closing capacity. The district benefits from a positive state funding environment, a very flexible labor environment, and well-funded pensions." Fitch Ratings, Inc. is one of the big three credit rating agencies, the other two being Moody's and Standard & Poor's.



Mr. Okerlund said, "The AAA bond rating will result in even better market reception of the district's bonds when they are sold and get a better interest rate for the patrons and taxpayers in the district."

Rick Ainge, Nebo School Board member and past president, stated, "This AAA bond rating equates to someone having a personal FICO credit score of 850."
