Nebo School Board Approved Raise

The Nebo Board of Education approved a 5% base salary increase for all employee groups for this school year. This is a significant investment into our most important assets, our employees. With this increase and other salary schedule changes, our beginning teachers will receive an annual compensation of \$42,388 for next year. Additionally, each employee will receive a bonus of up to \$500 this fall based on their FTE.

Nebo Employee Training & Certification

Utah State Law and Nebo District Policy require ALL employees to complete an Employee Training and Certification process that includes reviewing Nebo District's "Critical Policies". The purpose of this training is to certify that all Nebo employees understand the laws, procedures, and policies they are expected to follow and to ensure the safety and well-being of all students, faculty, and staff. This year, there is a new task entitled "Job Description" that will give employees the opportunity to review the essential functions of their job.

To access the portal, go to the employee homepage and click on Employee Training and Certification. The username is your firstname.lastname and the password is your Nebo email password. If you have questions please contact your supervisor for help.

How Can I Be Involved?

Q. Can I talk about the bond during contract hours?

A. Yes, it is okay to share factual information such as that found on the bond infographic, bond website and other district publications. However you must remain neutral and not suggest a "yes" or "no" vote.

Q. Can I give my opinion when I see a parent at the store?

A. Yes, as a private citizen you can advocate outside of school time.

Q. Can I advocate for the bond or join a bond advocacy group?

A. Yes, Nebo employees can advocate for the bond and join advocacy groups as private citizens. This advocacy may only take place off contract hours and using a personal email and social media accounts (Cannot use a Nebo email).

Q. Can I ask my students to tell their parents to vote "yes" for the bond?

A. No, that would be advocacy during contract hours.

Q. Can I share details of the bond?

A. Yes, you can share factual information such as the fact that high school boundaries won't change.

Apple Valley Elementary Opens

Apple Valley Elementary in Santaquin opened its doors on August 21 for the first day of school. Principal Chad Argyle welcomed the excited students, parents, faculty, and community leaders. A dedicated Scout Troop 1619 raised the flag for the pledge and students sang their hearts out. Superintendent Rick Nielsen introduced the many guests including the architects, engineers, and construction workers.

School Board member, Lisa Rowley, spoke to the audience about the history of the area including that the first school was built in Santaquin 162 years ago in 1856. The rock school house was 32 feet by 18 feet, and the roof was made of cane hauled from the shores of Utah Lake. She ended her comments with this quote by Wayne Dyer:

"When given a choice between being right or being kind, choose kind."

Apple Valley Elementary is on a 10 acre site in Santaquin with 6 acres of playing fields, 86,000 square feet of building, 31 classrooms, 2 computer classrooms, wood gymnasium floor and bleachers, plus more.

The students and parents were treated to apples at the ribbon cutting.


