Joining Student Council

- To join Student Council, we have to go through a 3step process:
 - Complete a 1-page essay explaining why we should be on Student Council and demonstrate our feelings toward serving others.
 - Participate in an interview with Mrs. Reynolds explaining "why we should be on Student Council."
 - Receive good scores from our teachers about our class responsibilities and overall behavior.
- Once we've qualified, Mrs. Reynolds draws names out of a hat in an equal way.
