Committee Reports:

- The Board received a report on the recent bond sale of just over \$97M. The proceeds will be used to complete the rebuild of Payson High School.
- The Board reviewed the Trustlands timeline and will take action in May.

- Policy DJA – Accounting Procedures**
 - Middle schools added to list of change fund amounts and locations
 - Procedures on legislatively appropriated supply funds for classroom teachers updated per Utah Admin. Code
 - Added directions for entering receipts
 - Added section on fraud reporting
 - Made other minor procedural and technical changes
- Policy DJB – Purchasing**
 - Updated requirements for use of federal funds per changes to federal regulations
 - Technical changes
- Policy DID- Asset Inventory**
 - Asset threshold for computers, laptops, Chromebooks and other student devices, power tools, small appliances and electronic equipment dropped from \$250 to \$150
 - Asset acquisition section for Chromebooks and other student devices created
 - Clarification on which departments are in charge of maintaining and renewing registration and insurance for District vehicles
 - Asset disposition section updated
- Policy GCPD – Employee Discipline**
 - Added details to investigation procedures
 - Clarified employment status of certain employee groups
 - Made technical changes
- Policy JDH – Student Attendance**
 - Removed moratorium on punitive actions, per state law
 - Updated enrollment status of students after ten consecutive unexcused absences, per state law
