## Superintendent's Message: Love – Serve – Inspire

"Liz Murray was raised in the Bronx by two loving but drug-addicted parents. She grew up in poverty, often without enough food, chronically absent from school and most of all, struggling to connect her education to a viable future." (thearthurproject.org) So, what does it take for a child born in these circumstances to rise above her challenges and become a successful adult who is a passionate advocate for underserved youth?

LOVE – Although Liz's parents were drug addicts and their very existence revolved around getting and using drugs, Liz "talks frequently about how much she loved them and how much they loved her, how they were highly intelligent but rendered hopeless at parenting by their drug dependence and consequent poverty." (The Guardian) In the direst circumstances, the words of Lao Tzu ring true, "Being deeply loved by someone gives you strength, while loving someone deeply gives you courage."

**SERVE** – "During Liz's middle school years, when her family fell apart due to drug addiction, mental illness and HIV/AIDS, an upstairs neighbor and trusted family friend named Arthur Flick stepped forward to help. Arthur tutored Liz, helped her complete homework, brought her on numerous day trips, and encouraged her to imagine a life beyond her circumstances. Above all, Arthur helped Liz understand that she matters.

"Arthur died suddenly from a heart condition when Liz was only 15-years-old, the same year Liz lost her mother. Despite this devastating loss, Liz identifies her relationship with Arthur in early adolescence as the catalyst behind her courage to return to school, while homeless.

Liz says, "Arthur's voice became the voice in my head that I used to speak to myself whenever it was time to have courage, to take a risk and to reach for something higher. He was gone, but he was still with me, helping me make the right choices. In that way, he will always be with me." (thearthurproject.org)

**INSPIRE** – "A dedicated educator who is an important influence in [Liz's] life, Perry Weiner's unique combination of rigor, humor, and gentle encouragement motivated Liz to work harder, [complete high school in two years instead of four] and, eventually, win acceptance to Harvard University." (litcharts.com) Reflecting upon Mr. Weiner's influence, Liz admonished a group of educators to, "see the students in front of you as human beings. Pass on the inspiration that Mr. Weiner gave [me]."

Today, Liz Murray focuses her efforts on strengthening impoverished middle school students through an initiative called The Arthur Project. She preaches that, "No one knows what is possible until they do it – until the attempt is made. Every day is another chance. The fork in the road happens hundreds of times each day, and it's the choices you make that will determine the shape of your life."

My hope is that we will make the choice each day to love, serve, and inspire those around us to Rise Up!


