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Successful Climbers Come Back to Tell Their Stories

Each school year offers a wide array of experiences reminding us that "the summit is what drives us, but 'The Climb' itself it what matters." As you read the following from renowned mountaineer Keval Hiren Kakka, consider some parallels between his story and your own 'Climbing' journey:

My journey started long back when I was in 7th grade. My family used to go on

a trip to Manali every year during my school vacations. My dad once asked me casually, 'What would you like to do with your vacations? Why don't you go on a hike? You will learn something of it.' It sounded fascinating to me.

I went on my first trek in Manali and it was magi-

cal. Once you step into the Himalayas, there is no going back. You completely lose yourself and are not the same person you used to be before. Something hit me right there. I was absolutely in love with the mountains.

Every year I started visiting that place and, after a time. I decided to convert my passion into a profession. Deep inside I knew this was not going to be an easy journey, but I had to find a way to stay connected to my passion.

After completing mountaineering courses, I started aiming for small peaks and eventually succeeded. Then I learned about

Mount Everest and how it is regarded as every mountaineer's dream.

I thought of breaking the national climbing record. I climbed Mount Everest and the neighboring Mount Lhotse in a record six days. Last year, I climbed Mount Annapurna, which is regarded as the world's deadliest mountain.

This year, I plan to do 'Project Tri Sum-

mit' (i,e, climbing three mountains above 8000m in a single season). I will be attempting Mount Kanchenjunga, Mount Makalu and Mount Dhaulagiri. Once I climb all three. I will become the first and fastest Indian to climb all of the peaks above 8000m in a span of seven years.

What I have learned over these years is that the moun-

tains demand a lot. A successful mountaineer is the one who comes back to tell the stories of their adventures.

Thank you for your contributions to a magical, successful school year. Each student and colleague has been blessed by your personal efforts. I hope you all have a wonderful summer and that you continue to enjoy 'The Climb.' We look forward to welcoming you back next year to "tell the stories of your adventures."
